A Big Thank You to all the Emergency Response crews who worked so hard to contain the Carr Fire, Including Cal Fire, Department of Forestry and fire protection, US Forest Service and all Local Fire Departments and agencies, Law Enforcement, Utility Workers, Public works, OES, National Guard, Medical Personnel, Red Cross, Haven Humane and hundreds of other agencies that traveled here to assist.

We are all forever changed in one way or another since the Carr Fire Incident and its devastation left behind. We can learn to be prepared for wildfire by having adequate clearance around our homes and removing overhanging branches. Removing pine needles, leaves and highly flammable brush like manzanita from around your house and outbuildings.

As our firefighters continue to fight raging fires locally and across the state, we will continue to support their efforts towards wildfire suppression.

Are you prepared for a Wildfire?

- Have adequate clearance around structures of all flammable material. Minimum of 100 feet in areas designated "Very High Fire Danger", (includes wood piles). (Greater distance may be required based on slope).
- Clear pine needles and leaves from gutters and roof. Trim back overhanging branches at least 10 feet from the outlet of any chimney or stovepipe.
- Replace roofing and siding with nonflammable or fire resistive materials.
- Reduce or remove flammable vegetation, including landscape plants, and replace with less flammable plants.
- Install and maintain strategic fuel breaks.
- Install smoke alarms in every level of your home and make sure that they are in good working order. Test them monthly and replace any smoke alarms that are 10 years old or older.
- You may have less than 3 minutes to escape a home fire. Every second counts, talk with your family about what to do if there is a wildfire. have an escape plan, and a meeting place outside of your home.
- Practice your escape plan with everyone in the family, practice this at least twice per year.
- Have a means of transporting your pets and livestock readily available.
- Collect valuables, important document, medications and other personal items in one place and be ready to evacuate if necessary. Maintain a mobile survival kit.http://www.readyforwildfire.org/Emergency-Supply-Kit/
