# STAGE 1: VOLUNTARY 25% WATER REDUCTION

- 1. Education Program: Notify customers by newsletter, press release or special meeting that a drought condition exists and offer water conservation information.
- 2. Encourage alternative day watering schedule, evening and early morning watering, etc.
- 3. District to reduce line and hydrant flushing.
- 4. New development to postpone landscaping.
- 5. Discourage filling of pools or ponds; topping off of existing pools is allowable.

WHEREAS, as a condition of receiving hardship water, the Bureau of Reclamation requires the District to adopt a drought contingency plan,

# DROUGHT CONTINGENCY PLAN

The Board of Directors has determined that a drought contingency plan must be adopted in the event of future dry years, and

The Bureau of Reclamation requires the District to adopt a drought contingency plan in order to apply for hardship water, and

Each stage of the three-stage plan below shall be adopted by separate resolution as conditions require.

STAGE I: VOLUNTARY WATER REDUCTION

- 1. Education program: Notify customers by newsletter, press releases, or special meetings, that a drought condition exists, and offer water conservation information.
- 2. Encourage alternate day watering schedule, evening and early morning watering, etc.
  - 3. District to reduce line and hydrant flushing.
  - 4. New development to postpone landscaping.
- Discourage filling of pools or ponds; topping off of existing. pools is allowable.

STAGE II: MANDATORY REDUCTION REQUIRED

25% REDUCTION

- 1. Require 25% cutback in water use based on historical usage as determined by the Board of Directors.
- 2. Strongly encourage alternate day watering schedule, evening and early morning watering.
- 3. Penalty for exceeding water allotment may be set by the Board at the time of implementation of this stage.
  - 4. No landscaping in new developments, and no construction water.
  - 5. Line flushing limited to severe problems only.

STAGE III: EMERGENCY REDUCTIONS REQUIRED

OVER 25% REDUCTION

- Amount of reduction to be established at the time of the emergency according to then-current conditions.
  - 2. Penalty for exceeding water allotment will be set by the Board. 3. No new service connections or water for construction allowed.
  - No line flushing except for extreme emergencies.

ALL REDUCTIONS BASED ON HISTORICAL USE DURING NORMAL WATER YEARS.

IN ALL STAGES, NO LESS THAN 1000 CUBIC FEET PER MONTH WILL BE ALLOWED FOR EACH HOUSEHOLD.

STAGE II & III: DROUGHT VARIANCE COMMITTEE WILL BE ESTABLISHED TO MEET WITH BOARD AND MANAGER TO CONSIDER INDIVIDUAL REQUESTS FOR ADDITIONAL WATER AND TO ADVISE THE BOARD ON THE CURRENT DISTRICT WATER SITUATION.
