Defensible space, coupled with home hardening, is essential to improve your home's chance of surviving a wildfire.

- •Remove all dead plants, grass and weeds (vegetation).
- •Remove dead or dry leaves and pine needles from your yard, roof and rain gutters.
- •Remove branches that hang over your roof and keep dead branches 10 feet away from your chimney.
- •Trim trees regularly to keep branches a minimum of 10 feet from other trees
